Heritage Sunday Coming in October

On "Heritage Sunday", Sunday, October 16th, we will be celebrating Good Shepherd's history. In preparation for this celebration, beginning July 3rd and continuing through August 15th, we will be taking orders for Good Shepherd Presbyterian Church Polo Shirts. A signup sheet, as well as a few samples will be available on the sign-up table in Conklin Hall.

Shirts will be available in white, blue, red and purple and will be made from a moisture wicking fabric for both men and women. There will also be a cotton pique version available for women (sorry - purple is not available in pique). The cost for each shirt is \$27.50 and all shirts must be prepaid by August 15th. The shirts will arrive sometime in September.

Catch the spirit and show our heritage, order your shirt, and celebrate who we are, to whom we belong and how we got here.

225th General Assembly of PC(USA) Meets in Louisville

The meeting of the 225th General Assembly convened in Louisville, KY, on June 18th with a Leader Briefing, worship and the first 3 plenary sessions. Beginning on the 19th, committees began meeting to discuss the business of the Assembly. Four groups of committees will meet one group at a time through July 2nd with the period from July 5th through July 9th dedicated to plenary sessions to consider proposals regarding the governance of the church and its policies.

Both Dave Patten and Rev. Ralph have served as commissioners to GA in past sessions and Bill Somplatsky-Jarman is in Louisville for the session.

One of the items on the agenda is consideration of an overture to GA from the Presbytery of Utah, among others, on behalf of the Belarus-Ukraine-Russia Mission (BURM) Network asking "that World Mission expand its presence in the region of Russia, Belarus, and Ukraine to listen deeply and broadly to the many different voices in the region. The people in each of these three nations are struggling under the weight of multiple conflicts and crises, both inside their countries and in their relationships with each other. It is important for the Church to understand these conflicts and to be aware of our own country's participation in them. The purpose of this proposed increased presence in the region is to educate our constituency about the complexities of the situations, enabling Presbyterians to evaluate critically and neutralize the effects of propaganda." The overture was submitted prior to the start of the Ukraine war and is even more timely now. Rev. Ralph will be addressing GA in support of the overture on behalf of Presbytery.

Assuming it is agreed at this year's GA, the 226th General Assembly will be in 2024 in Salt Lake City. Many hands will be needed to make this event happen and Presbytery will need all of our help. More on that next year and in 2024.



Rev. Ralph's Food for Thought

Why are you in despair, my soul? And why are you restless within me? Wait for God, for I will again praise Him For the help of His presence, my God. My soul is in despair within me; Therefore I remember You from the land of the Jordan And the peaks of Hermon, from Mount Mizar. Deep calls to deep at the sound of Your waterfalls; All Your breakers and Your waves have passed over me. The LORD will send His goodness in the daytime; And His song will be with me in the night, A prayer to the God of my life. I will say to God my rock, "Why have You forgotten me? Why do I go about mourning because of the oppression of the enemy?" As a shattering of my bones, my adversaries taunt me, While they say to me all day long, "Where is your God?" Why are you in despair, my soul? And why are you restless within me? Wait for God, for I will again praise Him For the help of His presence, my God.

Psalm 42:5-11 NASB



The writer of Psalm 42 is having a two-way conversation, one with God and one with himself. It is clear that he is living through difficult times and wondering where God is? In fact, in the face of his difficulties there are those who are raising the same question. Yet, in his difficult days he responds to adversity by turning to the God he trusts. His words reflect hope, the true hope of Christian faith.

In a very real sense, we are living through difficult times, I need not list the challenges we and our world are facing. It would be a simple thing to curl up in a ball and wish it would all go away.

However, the psalmist will have none of that. He asks himself, "Why do you despair? Don't you remember?' The psalmist remembers those days and places where God was with him. Times where he experienced God's love and presence. And in those remembrances, he knows God will be clearly present again. His hope is in God, true hope that knows not the words if, or maybe, but only will and then.

As Christians we possess those same remembrances. Especially when we consider the proclamation of Easter morning when we have the guarantee that in this world and life we are God's beloved people, and not even death can separate us from His love, not even the little troubles of our times.

For we have the assurance of things hoped for, the promise of things to come.

Christian Education

Rev. Ralph says that probably he would identify Romans 8 as his favorite chapter in the whole Bible. Paul's letter to the Romans probably has had the most significant effect on the life and history of the church since its inception during the first century. The reformer Dr. Martin Luther identified Romans as the source of his conversion to Christian faith. Thus, we are excited to offer a nine-week study of Paul's letter to the Romans beginning August 28th and concluding October 24th. The study will take place in the CE building on Monday evenings with a potluck supper at 6:00 pm. The study will include a student workbook so signing up for the study in Conklin Hall will be helpful in order to have the books here and in sufficient number for the study. Come join in!

There aren't many special days in the church in the months of July and August. In fact, July has only one - Immigration Sunday on July 3rd. In August, the 6th is Hiroshima Day, remembering the dropping of the first atomic bomb at the end of World War II. August has a youth theme where the 7th is College and Young Adult Sunday followed by Youth in the Church and World the 14th, Public Education Sunday and Young Adult Volunteer Commissioning Sunday on the 21st.

Congregational Growth & Care

LUNCH AND LEARN - On Thursday, June 9th we learned how Precision Medicine, a service of Intermountain Healthcare at our St. George Regional Hospital, is involved in the ground-breaking HerediGene Population Study. The IHC project, in conjunction with deCode Genetics in Iceland, where the specimens are processed, is seeking to collect blood samples from 500,000 participants and is the largest ongoing research study of DNA ever conducted. Our guest speakers were Megan Pucci and Shawnee Snow, Business Operations Coordinators for Intermountain Precision Genomics and Mart Roundy, Clinical Research Coordinator. In case you missed it, a recording of this first Lunch and Learn event may be found on the church website under "Activities - Health and Wellness." You'll hear not only about the HerediGene Study from our luncheon speakers, but also about ongoing research in genetics from Dr. Lincoln Nadauld, Executive Director of Precision Medicine and Precision Genomics and Healthcare, and his colleagues. Patients relate stories of lifesaving care they have received, as well as share their personal motivations for becoming involved in the study. And YOU can join them. There is no charge to donate your blood and become part of the study, information is confidential and, according to the GINA Act of 2008, may not be used to discriminate against you. ALL are welcome to donate and may do so at any IHC blood draw station. For questions or information, please contact: HerediGene.org or 833-698-1727

Thanks so much for your generosity.



Building Fund Update

When we took out our mortgage, we estimated that we needed \$384,000 to pay off the mortgage and have the resources to meet our needs for maintaining and improving our facilities. Now that our mortgage has been retired, we have turned our attention to several major maintenance items and improvements that need to be addressed over the next several years. These projects, totaling more than \$145,000, need to be funded. We still need your help.

Through **June 26th** we have received pledges towards our third campaign totaling **\$56,100** and additional cash donations of **\$64,697** giving us a total for all three campaigns of **\$315,810** or about **82.2** of our **\$384,000** goal.

While we are not currently conducting a Building Fund campaign, we do need donations to the Building Fund to ensure that our buildings and grounds are kept in good condition. Please consider a donation to the Building Fund to help us reach our goal.
