

## **Rev. Ralph's Food for Thought**

But the eleven disciples proceeded to Galilee, to the mountain which Jesus had designated. When they saw Him, they worshiped Him; but some were doubtful. And Jesus came up and spoke to them, saying, "All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age. Matthew 28:16-20 (NASB)



Presbyterians love acronyms, for example like GA or COM, (General Assembly, Committee On Ministry), to name just a couple. One particular acronym that is of particular note to us is BURM, (Belarus, Ukraine, Russian, Mission) network. BURM is a network of Presbyterian Church's involved with the work and mission ministries of our partner churches and Christian organizations in eastern Europe. BURM is a part of Presbyterian World Mission.

What you may not be aware of is that since 2015, with the formation of the partnership between Good Shepherd and our sister church in Dorogobuzh, Russia, we became members of BURM.

This is a partnership that, even as the war in the Ukraine continues, has drawn us and our brothers and sisters in Russia very close together in prayer and support.

Unfortunately, with the war's ongoing conflict, we are currently unable to visit our partners in Russia, Ukraine, and Belarus. Our Mission Co-Worker Ellen Smith, on behalf of BURM, has now expanded our contacts and partnerships with Christian organizations and churches in Lithuania, Poland, Hungary, Romania and Moldova.

This past spring a BURM mission team visited Lithuania and Poland. This summer a BURM mission team will be visiting Moldova and Romania. I will be a member of that mission team from August 30<sup>th</sup> through September 15<sup>th</sup>. Our team will be visiting Christian organizations and churches that are actively working with Ukrainian refugees. In fact, one of the organizations that we will be meeting with is operating under a grant from the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) program of the PCUSA. (More acronyms!)

Moldova is a small poor country that borders Ukraine, yet they have taken in more refugees from the Ukraine, predominantly the elderly, women, and children, than any other country.

Several years ago I preached on the Great Commission from the pulpit of our sister church in Dorogobuzh. Translated by Ellen's husband Al, I declared in the spirit of the Commission that the Kingdom of God knows neither national boundaries or languages. I continue to believe this fervently even more so today.

I look forward to greeting our brothers and sisters in Moldova and Romania on your behalf and on behalf of our common Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

Please keep me in your prayers as I make this journey.

## **Buildings & Grounds**

The Memorial Garden is now completed. In addition to the modifications I described a couple of months ago, we just completed having the gazebo repaired and completely repainted. It looks marvelous! We also received a check from the Washington County Water Conservancy District for \$5,482 or \$2 per square foot of grass that we removed. The reduced watering required has already paid dividends as our water use in May was 10,300 gallons below our 2022 usage. Thanks again to Guy Schultzman for leading this project.

Our next project is to replace the parking lot lights with new LED fixtures. The old lights are decades old and do not provide a lot of illumination. Also, the poles are fiberglass and are beginning to show the effects of our hot summers. We hope to have the new lights installed before the days get short again this fall.

**GSPC Book Club:** bring your lunch and join the discussion on Thursday July 27<sup>th</sup> in the CE Building at Noon. The book title for July will be posted on the Christian Education bulletin board in Conklin Hall.

**Monday Evening Potluck and Bible Study Group** will meet each Monday September 18<sup>th</sup> through October 30<sup>th</sup>, at 5:30 pm in the CE Building. The series is based on the New York Times bestseller, <u>The Case for Christ</u>, which has sold over 5 million copies. All sessions begin with sharing food and fellowship. The first six sessions will have a video segment followed by discussion, led by pastor Ralph, from the <u>Case for Christ Study Guide</u>. The last session will feature the fascinating "Case for Christ" movie, which retraces Lee Strobel's spiritual journey from atheism to faith. It's a film you won't want to miss!

If you would like to participate, please sign up on the registration sheet in Conklin Hall to ensure you receive your book and study guide prior to the first session.

BOOK DESCRIPTION: Is there credible evidence that Jesus of Nazareth really is the Son of God? In the book, <u>Case for</u> <u>Christ</u>, former atheist and Chicago Tribune journalist Lee Strobel takes an investigative look at the evidence from the fields of science, philosophy, and history. He examines a dozen experts with doctorates from schools such as Cambridge, Princeton, and Brandeis, asking hard-hitting questions - and building a captivating case for Christ's divinity. Strobel asks challenging questions like:

- How reliable is the New Testament?
- Does evidence for Jesus exist outside the Bible?
- Is Jesus who he said he was?
- Is there any reason to believe the resurrection was an actual event?

Winner of the Gold Medallion Book Award and twice nominated for the Christian Book of the Year Award, Strobel's tough, point-blank questions read like a captivating, fast-paced novel. But it's not fiction. It's a riveting quest for the truth about history's most compelling figure.
