Ready for a Potluck?

October was busy. November and early December will be busier!

The Women's Guild will hold their annual Rummage, Craft and Bake Sale from 9:00 am to 2:00 pm on November 4th in Conklin Hall. Come and check out the goodies and have a bowl of chili for lunch.

Our Stewardship campaign, Step Up - Stewardship is Heart Work! continues through November and December. During a fellowship potluck on November 5th, Chris Schleter will present our 2024 budget but in a new form. This year's budget will be a "narrative" budget where we take the pages of numbers that make up the detailed budget and allocate each of those numbers to one of four broad categories that represent the ministries of the church: Worship and Music, Mission and Outreach, Pastoral Care and Education. During the luncheon, each table will have a leader who will facilitate discussion of the budget and where God is taking our church next year and beyond. Chris will circulate and be available to answer any questions about the detailed budget.

The Interfaith Choir and Children's Choir will hold a special concert, "Simple Gifts" on November 15th at 7:00 pm at the Tabernacle.

We'll participate in the annual Ecumenical Thanksgiving Service with Shepherd of the Hills United Methodist Church and New Promise Lutheran Church on November 17^{th} at 7:00 pm at Shepherd of the Hills.

On November 19th we'll celebrate our many gifts from God with our annual Thanksgiving potluck luncheon after worship. We'll supply the turkey and ask each of you to bring a side, salad or dessert to share.

The annual CROP Hunger Walk will be November 18th. We will begin at 10:00 am Larkspur Park in Bloomington Hills. We hope that everyone will either walk with us or donate to one of our walkers. Good Shepherd has a history of making the largest donation to the CROP Walk of any organization in the area and we hope the tradition will continue.

Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes are still available. Pick up one or several shoeboxes, fill them with goodies for children in developing countries and bring them back on November 19th, the Sunday before Thanksgiving, when we'll dedicate our shoeboxes for 2023. The Knotty Knitters are nearly done packing 110 boxes this year to add to our totals. Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes introduce Christ to children who may never have received a gift before, and the children are offered an opportunity to know our Lord and learn more about Him.

There will be more, many more, potlucks and events during December so get out your cookbooks and find new things to share.

There won't be a dull moment in our church life, and we hope that everyone will participate in as many of these events as possible. There is no church without you!



Rev. Ralph's Food for Thought

The point is this: the one who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and the one who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each of you must give as you have made up your mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance, so that by always having enough of everything, you may share abundantly in every good work.

As it is written, 'He scatters abroad, he gives to the poor; his righteousness endures for ever.'

He who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will supply and multiply your seed for sowing and increase the harvest of your righteousness. You will be enriched in every way for your great generosity, which will produce thanksgiving to God through us; for the rendering of this ministry not only supplies the needs of the saints but also overflows with many thanksgivings to God. Through the testing of this ministry you glorify God by your obedience to the confession of the gospel of Christ and by the generosity of your sharing with them and with all others, while they long for you and pray for you because of the surpassing grace of God that he has given you. Thanks be to God for his indescribable gift!

2 Corinthians 9:6-15 (NRSV)



Whenever I read this passage from Paul's second letter to the Corinthians I am reminded of what seems now a life time ago, in a former church, when on a Sunday morning the chair of the Stewardship committee from the pulpit quoted from the passage to the congregation. I remember her words well, "Remember, God loves a cheerful giver, but he will take it from the grumpy ones as well!"

Yes, we are in that time of year when we are asked to prayerfully consider our gifts, faith and generosity. We are reminded that our stewardship is not hard work, it is heart work. A joyful response to what God has given and continues to provide for us all. Paul invites the Corinthians and us to increase the harvest of generosity and thus our righteousness. Paul speaks of giving in terms of overflowing with thanksgiving to God.

Paul, in just a few words, reminds us that in and through Jesus Christ we have all received surpassing grace as a gift from God. We are called to respond with a generosity of thanksgiving, with our gifts of time, talents and treasure. Paul is inviting each of us to step up in our faith in support of our common ministry and proclamation of the Gospel, here and around the world.

Paul reminds that doing so is an act of faith, trusting God to provide for us as we provide for our ministries out of our abundance. And we are called to do so joyfully!

As we have entered the harvest season of Thanksgiving to God, I invite and encourage all us to again read Paul's words to us, take them prayerfully into our hearts, and joyfully give thanks to God by our gifts to God. Remembering, that stewardship is Heart work!

Buildings & Grounds

At the October Session meeting, Guy Schultzman presented a preliminary report from his committee that is looking into energy efficiency improvements to our buildings and the installation of a solar energy system.

The first of the proposed updates is replacing all of the windows in the CE Building. This will markedly improve the energy efficiency of the building and will save on heating and cooling costs going forward. Session approved the project, and we hope to have it completed in the next few weeks.

The second item was the approval of a conceptual plan for a solar energy system that we hope will achieve net zero electric usage and will be expandable as our needs change. The plan has the system installed in the northwest corner of the property, behind the two sheds. This area has many advantages in that it does not detract from the look of the church property, it receives full sun throughout the year, and it allows us to address some security issues that have been occurring in that area of the property. Session approved the conceptual plan, and the committee was authorized to move to detailed planning and the identification of a contractor.

Thanks to Guy and his committee as they seek to find ways to reduce our environmental footprint and save the church money.

Rev. Deb Worley of White Rock PC and Ms. Kathy Mitchell, a middle school guidance counselor and Trinity PC member, also participated in the study travel seminar Native Lands of the Southwest.

If you want to contribute to the bookmobile project, please make out a check to GSPC, and be sure to note on the check that it is for the bookmobile project.

CROP Walk: Envelopes for those who want to walk in the CROP Walk are available NOW. If you would like to walk, please see me and I'll get you an envelope. Stewardship

Welcome to the beautiful cooler days of fall! I hope everyone is well and enjoying the pleasant temperatures. Thank you to everyone who has continued in faithfulness and generous giving to our church. Please consider prayerfully your future giving to help sustain and grow the important ministries we offer.

Stewardship, continued

Our Stewardship campaign, *Step Up - Stewardship is Heart Work,* began during fellowship on October 1st with Rev. Ralph presenting a short program about the Christian foundations of stewardship.

We'll hold our second Stewardship luncheon on November 5th. We'll present the proposed budget for 2024 but we'll be doing it in a new way. Instead of five pages of numbers that, with a few exceptions, causes people's heads to explode, we'll present a narrative budget. We'll condense all of those numbers down into four areas that make up the core mission of the church: Worship and Music, Mission and Outreach, Pastoral Care and Education. Doing a bit of arithmetic, we'll allocate every line item in the detailed budget to one or more of these areas and arrive at a budget for each area. We hope and expect that you will better understand what the church does and what our needs are, and how you can help us to meet those needs for 2024. Each table will have a table leader who will help the people at their table to begin a conversation about stewardship and, for those who want to see it, each table will have a few copies of the detailed budget.

The following week you will receive a letter in the mail asking for your stewardship commitment (pledge) for 2024. Please remember that a commitment is a plan - how you plan to help us meet our needs. It is not chiseled in stone but is your best estimate of how you can help. If at some point in 2024 you find that you will be unable to fulfill your commitment, just let LaVerna know, and she will make an adjustment.

On November 19th, we'll combine our Thanksgiving Brunch with our final stewardship luncheon, and we'll provide an update on how we are doing with our pledge drive.

Finally, we will dedicate our pledges during worship on Sunday, December 24th, Christmas Eve.

We look forward to everyone's commitment to our mission in our community and the world in 2024.
